Exhibition Judge Steve Lopes (Australian Figurative Artist and Printmaker)

Born in Sydney and studied at the University of New South Wales, gaining his Bachelor of Fine Arts in 1988. He is a painter and printmaker and known for his figurative landscapes.

In 2017 he travelled to the former battlefields of the Western Front in France and Belgium with 10 other well-known Australian artists and was invited to exhibit works in the touring exhibition 'Salient' – Contemporary artists at the Western Front.

He has won many awards and his works acquired in collections such as the National Art Gallery of Australia, Parliament House Art Collection, Canberra, Time Warner Collection in New York. He won the 2018 Gallipoli Art Prize in Sydney.

Judge's Comments

Now I know every judge of an art award says this but this time it was incredibly difficult task-overall the quality of the works was very high.

It was hard to narrow it down and it showed the quality of this inspiring exhibition and the artistic health of this Society. It was really hard to separate a winner and all three works I'm about to mention jostled it out for the final prize.

I really enjoyed seeing what the members are choosing to paint, sculpt and draw. Subject matter is really important, and I found in each work a level of heartfelt connection between the artist and their vision and also a high level of technical skill and 'finish' which is really pleasing to see.

It's so great to see such a superb organisation as this championing the arts and its passion is inspiring. Art has never been so important as it is now and it's so great to see after all this incredible history the Royal Art Society of New south Wales is still going strong.

Commended – Susanna Chen Chow for Mt Sonder – Larapinta.

This is a great tough painting of Central Australia. It's filled with emotion and quite a powerful depiction of the Larapinta- a place which I've painted, and it captures the feel of that area. Her work has a rumbling energy to it and a great understanding of paint and its handling.

Highly Commended – Neil Hetherington for Coastal village – Cornwall.

This is a beguiling painting it stood out immediately from the very beginning. It had a confidence and courage to is simplicity. What appealed to me with is its 'vibrancy' and atmosphere – it is just a beautiful painting and it transported me back to Cornwall.

Winner – Teri Hiley for Bubbling Up

This is a fascinating picture – it has great subject matter which is always important for me when looking at a work. There is an interesting level of layering going on and patterning. The paintings reduced colour tone and its complexity is what stood out for me and got it over the line. It's an alluring work that calls out at you after a few viewings and in the end, I thought it a worthy winner.

From the RAS Collection – by Secretary Christine Feher

William Grunstein FRAS

William Grunstein (Bill) was born in Warsaw in 1921 and died in 2013 in Sydney.

Bill survived WW11 as he was sent from one concentration camp to another – in fact 14 altogether, including Dachau, surviving by both his resilience and by being given odd jobs, including making aeroplane parts, drawing, writing but mostly because of his artistic talent. He was handed around by the Nazis to paint portraits, the faces of history.

As a small show of defiance, risking his life each time, Bill engraved the name of each camp he was in on to his metal cigarette box, along with the dates he was there. The box, made out of metal scraps of aeroplane parts, was shared between him and his friend Joseph Koplewicz. If it had been found by the camp officers, neither man would have survived. It is now at the US Holocaust Museum in Washington.

Bill arrived in Australia in 1949, followed shortly by Hania, his fiancée, and they married in 1951. Bill studied fashion design and art at East Sydney Technical College. Over the years Bill established a dress factory in Surry Hills which became extremely successful.

Bill became a member of the Royal Art Society in 1968 and over the next 40 years was a teacher, Fellow and Director of the Art School. His paintings were frequently exhibited at the Society and the Holdsworth Galleries. His works are held at the Sydney Opera House, the Sydney Conservatorium and in many private and overseas collection.
