Materials List

Bring your full normal painting kit. Paint and brushes etc and we will use the following colours which is my basic pallet.

Artist Quality Paints Preferred

French Ultramarine Blue, Viridian Burnt Sienna Titanium White Mid. Cadmium Yellow Yellow Ochre Cadmium Orange Cadmium Red Alizarin Crimson

I carry other colours which I may introduce according to the subject.

Brushes..Large. Flats 12, 10,8. Filberts. 6 or 7...Sable Type Riggers 2,3.

Mediums- Odourless Turps...Archival Lean Medium or similar...

Good size pallet...Rags or wipes.

Boards or canvas sizes: 1, 20"x16", 500x400...16"x12' 400x300

We can for those who would prefer, use a larger 24'x18" 600x450 for landscape.

Preferably white we can tint to suit subject if needed.

Bay Art Supplies here at the RAS has a variety of canvas boards available, odourless turps etc. Cash only.

From the Archives – Secretary Christine Feher

Quotes from the RAS Catalogues – I found these observations fitting for the times they were written.

1943

Visitors to this exhibition may possibly not like some of the pictures on its walls, but at least they will be able to understand them. The Council of the Society believes that it is possible to combine intelligibility to the average citizen with good craftsmanship, vision and vitality. Of that art, miscalled "modern" which insults the intelligence of Mr. Everyman, none will be found here. Nevertheless, there will be found some good vital Australian painting.

1944

This 1944 exhibition of the Society comes at a time when the world can look forward with hope to the immediate future. But for many years so many pictures been received for judging, and out of this selection the exhibition sets a new standard of quality. Pictorial Art, in the years between and during two great wars, has blossomed strangely and disturbingly in many blooms of decadence, but in all countries, there are some artists who refuse to follow the cults in the latest fashions – knowing that fashions have nothing to do with good painting. The things that last in Art are Sanity and Craftmanship. Fashions and movements disappear and seem absurd to later generations, but good drawing, good values, good painting, and sincerity always endure.

This Society aims at the encouragement of that sort of painting, and a glance around these walls will convince the intelligent visitor that he is seeing a collection of pictures, most of which depict Australia, and could not have been painted anywhere else but in Australia. The Society, in such an exhibition, feels it is helping to keep a national vision alive.


Three-Day Workshop: Portrait Starting Methods
