1940

Art is not limited to a period or country; good art is for all time. It makes its influence felt and requires neither apology nor long explanation. We offer neither for the work on the walls, which is sane, thoughtful and earnest, and should deliver its own message.

1942

This, the 63rd exhibition of the Society is held in troubled times. The council, however, believes that while the worst in human nature is unleashed all over the world it is as well to have a reminder that sanity and love of the beautiful still survives and will outlive the lunacy of war, and the insolence of tyrants large and petty.

This exhibition is an exhibition of democracy – for any plain man and woman who love pictures. It has been painted and chosen by artists who do not pride themselves on their superiority to and their puzzlement of "The Common Herd' or bust themselves with select art which only a small cult can appreciate. Whatever faults may be found, the gross fault of artistic snobbery will not.

Materials List

Bring your full normal painting kit. Paint and brushes etc and we will use the following colours which is my basic pallet.

Artist Quality Paints Preferred

French Ultramarine Blue, Viridian Burnt Sienna Titanium White Mid. Cadmium Yellow Yellow Ochre Cadmium Orange Cadmium Red Alizarin Crimson

I carry other colours which I may introduce according to the subject.

Brushes..Large. Flats 12, 10,8. Filberts. 6 or 7...Sable Type Riggers 2,3.

Mediums- Odourless Turps...Archival Lean Medium or similar...

Good size pallet...Rags or wipes.

Boards or canvas sizes: 1, 20"x16", 500x400...16"x12' 400x300

We can for those who would prefer, use a larger 24'x18" 600x450 for landscape.

Preferably white we can tint to suit subject if needed.

Bay Art Supplies here at the RAS has a variety of canvas boards available, odourless turps etc. Cash only.

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ART BALLOT FUNDRAISER

The major fundraiser for the Society each year is the Art Ballot Fundraiser and it's a time when we ask our members to support this by donating a painting/s. The painting can be any size, medium and a subject of your choice, except portraits – these simply do not suit the fundraiser. All works need to be well framed and presented, after all this showcases your painting and advertises you as an artist.

If you cannot donate one of your own paintings, then a painting of high standard by another artist is acceptable. Please be generous this year for the benefit of the Society. Contact Secretary Christine and arrange a time to deliver your donation, or, alternatively if you cannot do so Christine will arrange collection.

If you would like a little history – the RAS 1880 – 2023 – in the late 1940's the Society decided to find a home for the Society instead of renting in various rooms around Sydney, so the search was on and in order to raise funds for this project, the Art Ballot was formed. Members donated a painting, tickets were sold and on the day of the draw and ticket holders took home a painting. It took some five years to raise sufficient money and in 1956 the Society purchased 25 Walker Street North Sydney and in March the following year, number 27. These premises had been turned into flats during the depression years and were in need of renovation. Over time this was done, and all helped by the fundraiser that were held in the following years.

Today the Art Ballot is the major fundraiser for the Society and with rising costs of rates, insurances, maintenance is needed more than ever.

Please donate to the Society and encourage people to purchase tickets. Spread the news on Facebook, Instagram wherever you can. Flyers are available at the RAS and online just speak to Christine at the RAS.

Together let's make this the most successful Art Ballot in the long history of the RAS.
