From the Archives – Secretary Christine Feher

Emily Letitia Paul was born in Bathurst and studied at Julian Ashton's Sydney Art School with Thea Proctor. She exhibited with the Art Society of NSW in 1892 (prior to the Royal Charter being granted Society in 1903) and up until 1914.


Two of her paintings were included in the 1898 Grafton Gallery Exhibition of Australian Art in London, which was a highly esteemed and respected exhibition. She studied in Europe and London and at the Académie Julien in Paris.

She painted in oils and watercolours and primarily still life subjects. She was influenced by US Socialists, and she later abandoned art and became a leading public speak for the Socialist Party. In 1914 she contested the Federal seat of Cook as a socialist, predictably unsuccessful. She died in January 1917.
