**Jane Wray** – Camden Art Prize – Highly Commended in 'Works on Paper', Highly Commended in the Thirroul Seaside Festival and Commended in the 'Agency Still Life Prize'.

**Kay McFarlane Smith** FRAS – Singleton Art Prize – Winner Traditional Prize and Best Overall Painting.

**Salwa Woodroffe** FRAS has been chosen the Artist-in-Residence and was also awarded the Denis Diderot grant at the Chateau d'Orquevaux north of France starting June next year. Only 20% are chosen in total from worldwide applicants (visual and performing artists and writers).

**Dee Jackson** was one of three artists invited to participate in an ABC Program called *AI vs Human:* The Creativity Experiment. Filming was over a day and evening and the 3 human artists were tasked with creating a portrait in 4 hours while, at the same time, an AI robot was programmed to create a portrait. The program can be seen on ABC iview.

### From the Archives – Secretary Christine Feher

Until the end of the 19th century, all the different 'Salons' and their equivalents across Europe, which held major exhibitions at regular intervals, would hang paintings in an identical system. The classic example was the annual Paris Salon, although from the late 1800's the same structure was copied at the yearly shows held in the Glaspalast in Munich and at the Spring, Autumn and Winter Exhibitions in Budapest's Hall of Arts. These exhibitions showed off more or less the entire artistic output of all the artists in the local Society over the previous year, so it was not unusual to have several thousand works on display at one time. This meant that the walls were covered from top to bottom with paintings packed closely side by side in several rows, with little regard for differences in genre or style.



This kind of arrangement made it difficult for individual works to achieve any kind of prominence so in the lead up to exhibitions, artists would try to influence where their works would be hung, and sometimes fought fiercely for the best locations. A true appreciation of the works was made even more difficult by the fact that exhibition rooms would be stacked full of carpets, pieces of furniture and potted plants, and as in such a stifling atmosphere, viewers would quickly lose focus and interest. This display principle, so prevalent in the 1880's and 1900's, was aptly described by one critic from Munich as 'hanging to death'.

To a lesser degree in the numbers of paintings hung in the Royal Art Society exhibitions followed this way of displaying paintings at the Garden Palace in the early 1880's.
